FAIR RULES & IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Animals cannot enter the showgrounds before 2pm Saturday 29th June 2019
- Animals must have left showgrounds by 10am Friday 5th July 2019
- All animals must have their NLIS tag scanned prior to judging
- All exhibitors must have public liability insurance
- All animals will be checked against registration papers prior to judging. Animals under 12 months must have a pending certificate if not fully registered. If there is no clearly visible form of ID (photo is preferred) then it will be at the committee's discretion to decline entry
- Youth section is open to Under 18 years old on the day of show, the handler is the exhibitor and all prize money and prizes will be awarded to that person
- All animals are in the main show. Ribbons & Prize Money will be allocated to 6th place as they stand in the class regardless of being a youth or red.
Additional ribbons will be allocated to the youth (1st - 4th) and the red (1st & 2nd).
The first two place getters of each section will compete for Champion and then Supreme Exhibit.
In the event that a youth or red exhibit is placed in the top two of their age group, they will be eligible for the "Main Show Champion" as well as youth and/or red.
- All animals that are owned by a syndicate or multiple memberships must be entered in those syndicate or multiple memberships, or leased by a single exhibitor in which case no Premier Breeder or Exhibitor points shall be awarded for that animal

- Premier Breeder and Exhibitor points will be allocated from 1st to 3rd place as they stand in the class.
- All handlers must lead the animal unassisted
- The fair will be conducted under the Holstein Australia show ethics
- 1st, 2nd and random animals will be selected from milking classes for ultrasound
- Exhibitors must complete the provided National Cattle Health Statement and return them with entry forms
- If the exhibitor is not the primary caretaker/fitter of the animals the provided Certification of Primary Caretaker/Fitter form must be completed by the person in charge and returned with entry forms
- A heifer entered in a DRY class, if calved at the time of the Fair shall compete in an IN MILK class or vice versa
- Entrants in the Veteran Cow class must meet requirements and production certificates must accompany entry forms
- There will be no tents/gazebo's allowed inside the Exhibition Centre
- **Best Udder:** a winner will be selected in each In Milk class and these winners will compete for Supreme Intermediate Udder and Supreme Senior Udder
- **Fodder** for cattle is available from **Bush's Produce (03) 5443 5960**, daily delivery with on truck EFTPOS facilities available
- **Cattle Bedding:** Sawdust will be provided, for those who would like to purchase straw, small squares of straw will be available for \$6.60 each and can be pre-ordered and paid with entries
- **Veterinary Services:** are available from **Cohuna Veterinary Clinic (03) 5456 2666**
- **Accommodation** information is available from **Bendigo Tourism 1800 813 153** or visit our Facebook page for suggestions
- **Catering:** The dining room will open from Sunday evening through to Thursday evening, Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner available on all days except Sunday. There will also be a food van on site.
- **Electrical Appliances:** All electrical appliances and power leads used on the showgrounds must comply with **AS3760 2003**. All electrical appliances and leads must have current compliance tags attached to the supply end of the lead.
- **Milking:** A four unit dairy will be available.

The winter fair will incorporate a Youth section (handler under 18 years), a Red Holstein and a main Holstein section all to be judged together in the allocated animal age groups. Ribbons will be allocated to each section within the class. The youth section will finish at Junior Champion and the main show and red section will continue until the last class.

- Class 1:** Junior Handlers, Under 12 years of age
- Class 2:** Intermediate Handlers, 12 – 15 years of age
- Class 3:** Senior Handlers, Over 16 years of age
- Class 4:** Autumn calf born after 1/4/19
- Class 5:** Summer calf born 1/1/19 – 31/3/19
- Class 6:** Spring calf born 1/10/18 – 31/12/18
- Class 7:** Winter calf born 16/8/18 – 30/9/18
- Class 8:** Winter calf born 1/7/18 – 15/8/18
- Class 9:** All Australian Calf Class, heifer born after the 4/7/18 handler under 17 years of age
- Class 10:** Autumn yearling born 1/4/18 – 30/6/18
- Class 11:** Summer yearling born 1/1/18 – 31/3/18
- Class 12:** Spring yearling born 1/10/17 – 31/12/17
- Class 13:** Winter yearling born 1/7/17 – 30/9/17
- Class 14:** 2 years old heifer dry born 1/1/17 – 30/6/17
